The Anatomy of a Great Lesson

Is there a better feeling for a teacher than to walk out of a classroom knowing they have just delivered a great lesson? But what makes a good lesson? In this workshop, we will look at what ingredients we need to plan a great lesson, how to get the balance right between, active and passive, technology and tradition, materials and what the students give us so that we will all get that happy feeling more often.



David Cleary is a DELTA qualified English language teacher and teacher trainer living and working in Brno. He came to the Czech Republic in the summer of 2000 and has worked here ever since. Towards the end of his first year Dave went with a colleague to a teacher development session, his first, and from that moment he has been interested in teacher development; both his own and that of others. Dave's first teacher training experience was to his peers, and for more than a decade he has written and delivered teacher training sessions at both international conferences and on local training courses.

Learning a foreign language is an adventurous journey. Often, we travel along the 'main road' learning grammar and vocab, but there are also many 'side roads' that can take us to people's homes, to playgrounds, restaurants, schools and offices. We may end up in a foreign country exploring its famous landmarks, as well as unusual customs and traditions. In this session we will take some of these side roads to try out practical examples of how to learn more than English in the English language classroom.

She is currently a head of the state language school in Ostrava where she is responsible both for the school management and methodological supervision, and at the same time a part time teacher. Martina has got 6 years experience as eTwinning ambassador and teacher trainer in the area of ICT. Apart from eTwinning she recently lectured a national webinar for teachers about iTEC – learning scenarios of the future classroom. In years 2013–2015 she was involved in Creative Classrooms Lab project as a member of pedagogical board, she had an expert position in CCL project.
